• Rigorous implementation of **mentorship** scheme in the college.

It was resolved that the mentorship scheme in the college was to undergo strict implementation since the fruits of the scheme were sweet up to the exception.

- It was also decided that teachers along with their respective student group of about 40 must sit for 10 to 15 minutes together on the campus under the sky (i.e. not in classrooms) and have some formal talk so that students must come up with their personal problems and complexes. This scheme also helped to know the financial and family problems of students and also their family background.
- The scheme also helped create healthy and intimate relation between students and teachers.
- Atmosphere of healthy competition is expected to be created on the campus and students' performance in the examination is expected to be raised and improved.
- Celebration of cultured and academic events on the campus that are helpful in creating and inculcating national values, women empowerment and self employment.

- The college organized in all more than **30 significant activates** on the campus in which students' participation was observed.

- Mentorship scheme was tackled in such a way that it became a movement on the campus between the teachers and the students. On every Wednesday, teachers and their pupils which were about 40 in number, used to sit together on the ground making circles and had informal talks. However these talks were on the line of national issues which were publicly declared on the PCS (Public Communication System) of the college at the time of national anthem. Office communication was also made through parent teachers which resulted in effective implementation of academic and administrative activities.
- **Departmental tours** were organized keeping in mind the students' association with the outside world especially is controlled atmosphere. History, Geography, languages including Marathi, Hindi and English departments took their students on educational tours though the main intention was to acquaint them with the world outside which is real and practical in attitude.
- Women empowerment remains one of our main concerns. Girl students' outstanding participation in all academic and co-curricular and extra curricular activities was observed.
- Voters day was celebrated. A rally in association with the Tehsil Office Khatav (Vaduj) was organized the results of

which are seen in the bumper voting in the subsequent parliamentary elections.
