

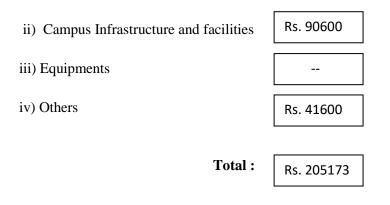

- Such students were taken into confidence
- Those who had come on with very personal issues, their issues were kept with the mentor teacher only.
 - Only problematic cases were reported to the principal and remedies were sought

Annexure – III

Analysis of feedbacks – the process

- Feed backs are obtained from stakeholders on overall campus experience.
- Reading of the feedbacks is done by the committee consisting senior faculty and principal
- Grade points are given A B C D to academic aspects on the campus.
- Academic aspects with C & D grade points are discussed and remedies arts sought with D grade.
- It is observed that academic aspects with D should be converted to B gradually.
